 - We give thanks to all the waters.
 - We give thanks to the fish.
 - We give thanks to the plants.

 - We give thanks to the life sustainers (plant foods).
 - We give thanks to the fruits.
 - We give thanks to the animals.
 - We give thanks to the trees.
